Glory to God in the highest, and peace to his people on earth. Lord God, heavenly King, almighty God and Father, we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory. Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us; you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

**Collect for the First Sunday after Pentecost: Trinity Sunday** (*Book of Common Prayer, 228*)

*Celebrant:* Almighty and everlasting God, you have given to us your servants grace, by the confession of a true faith, to acknowledge the glory of the eternal Trinity, and in the power of your divine Majesty to worship the Unity: Keep us steadfast in this faith and worship, and bring us at last to see you in your one and eternal glory, O Father; who with the Son and the Holy Spirit live and reign, one God, for ever and ever.

*People:* **Amen.**

**Collect for Thanksgiving for Heroic Service** (*Memorial Day*)

*Celebrant:* O Judge of the nations, we remember before you with grateful hearts the men and women of our country who in the day of decision ventured much for the liberties we now enjoy. Grant that we may not rest until all the people of this land share in the benefits of true freedom and gladly accept its disciplines. This we ask in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord.

*People:* **Amen.**

**Prayer for the Hurricane Season**

*Celebrant:* Almighty and everlasting God, Creator and Preserver of all humankind, grant to us Your people, protection against the ravages of hurricane, flood, earthquake, drought or other calamities; that in tranquility of weather we may rejoice in the comfort we ever desire and may always make right use of Your great goodness; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

*People:* **Amen.**

*The people sit for the Liturgy of the Word.*

**The First Lesson:** Isaiah 6:1-8

*Reader:* A reading from the Book of Isaiah.

In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lofty; and the hem of his robe filled the temple. Seraphs were in attendance above him; each had six wings: with two they covered their faces, and with two they covered their feet, and with two they flew. And one called to another and said: "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory." The pivots on the thresholds shook at the voices of those who called, and the house filled with smoke. And I said: "Woe is me! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips; yet my eyes have seen the King, the Lord of hosts!" Then one of the seraphs flew to me, holding a live coal that had been taken from the altar with a pair of tongs. The seraph touched my mouth with it and said: "Now that this has touched your lips, your guilt has departed and your sin is blotted out." Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" And I said, "Here am I; send me!"

*Reader:* The Word of the Lord.

*People:* **Thanks be to God.**

**Psalm 29:**

*(Page 620 of the Book of Common Prayer or as printed in the bulletin. We will read the psalm alternatively by verse).*

- 1 Ascribe to the Lord, you gods, \* ascribe to the Lord glory and strength.  
 2 **Ascribe to the Lord the glory due his Name; \* worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness.**  
 3 The voice of the Lord is upon the waters; the God of glory thunders; \* the Lord is upon the mighty waters.  
 4 **The voice of the Lord is a powerful voice; \* the voice of the Lord is a voice of splendor.**  
 5 The voice of the Lord breaks the cedar trees; \* the Lord breaks the cedars of Lebanon;  
 6 **He makes Lebanon skip like a calf, \* and Mount Hermon like a young wild ox.**  
 7 The voice of the Lord splits the flames of fire; the voice of the Lord shakes the wilderness; \* the Lord shakes the wilderness of Kadesh.  
 8 **The voice of the Lord makes the oak trees writhe \* and strips the forests bare.**

**The Second Lesson:** Romans 8:12-17

*Reader:* A reading from the Letter of Paul to the Romans.

So then, brothers and sisters, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh~ for if you live according to the flesh, you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live. For all who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God. For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received a spirit of adoption. When we cry, "Abba! Father!" it is that very Spirit bearing witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ- if, in fact, we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him.

*Reader:* The Word of the Lord.

*People:* **Thanks be to God.**

*The people stand for the Sequence Hymn and the Gospel.*

**Sequence Hymn:** Immortal, invisible, God only wise (#423, 1982 Hymnal) (10 a.m. only)

**The Holy Gospel:** John 3:1-17

*Gospeler:* The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

*People:* **Glory to you, Lord Christ.**

There was a Pharisee named Nicodemus, a leader of the Jews. He came to Jesus by night and said to him, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God; for no one can do these signs that you do apart from the presence of God." Jesus answered him, "Very truly, I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God without being born from above." Nicodemus said to him, "How can anyone be born after having grown old? Can one enter a second time into the mother's womb and be born?" Jesus answered, "Very truly, I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit. What is born of the flesh is flesh, and what is born of the Spirit is spirit. Do not be astonished that I said to you, 'You must be born from above.' The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit." Nicodemus said to him, "How can these things be?" Jesus answered him, "Are you a teacher of Israel, and yet you do not understand these things? "Very truly, I tell you, we speak of what we know and testify to what we have seen; yet you do not receive our testimony. If I have told you about earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you about heavenly things? No one has ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life. "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. "Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him.

## The Nicene Creed

*The Deacon or Celebrant shall say,*

Let us reaffirm our faith in the words of the Nicene Creed.

### *Celebrant and People*

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

*People:* Lord, have mercy.

*Leader:* For the peace of the world, that a spirit of respect and forbearance may grow among nations and peoples, we pray to you, O Lord.

*People:* **Lord, have mercy.**

*Leader:* For those in positions of public trust, especially Joseph, our President; Ron, our Governor, that they may serve justice, and promote the dignity and freedom of every person, we pray to you, O Lord.

*People:* **Lord, have mercy.**

*Leader:* For all who live and work in this community, we pray to you, O Lord.

*People:* **Lord, have mercy.**

*Leader:* For a blessing upon all human labor, and for the right use of the riches of creation, that the world may be freed from poverty, famine, and disaster, we pray to you, O Lord.

*People:* **Lord, have mercy.**

*Leader:* For the poor, the persecuted, the sick, and all who suffer; for refugees, prisoners, and all who in danger; that they may be relieved and protected, especially, Darah, Arthur, Rae Nelle, Alan our Deacon, Connie, Sheila, Marylee, Janet, Bruce, Ian, Kelly, Reece, Pat, Jeremy, Denis, Kate, Gale, Chuck, Kelly, Lise, Lee, Brenda, Dara, Buddy, Butch, Martina, Gilly, Deborah, Harold, Dorothy, Bill, Patricia, the Men of a Pocket Full of H.O.P.E., and those who are ill with the coronavirus; (*Are there others*), we pray to you, O Lord.

*People:* **Lord, have mercy.**

*Leader:* For this church, that we may be delivered from hardness of heart, and show forth your glory in all that we do, we pray to you, O Lord.

*People:* **Lord, have mercy.**

*Leader:* For our enemies and those who wish us harm; and for all whom we have injured or offended, we pray to you, O Lord.

*People:* **Lord, have mercy.**

*Leader:* For ourselves; for the forgiveness of our sins, and for the grace of the Holy Spirit to amend our lives, we pray to you, O Lord.

*People:* **Lord, have mercy.**

*Leader:* For all who have commended themselves to our prayers; for our families, friends, and neighbors; that being freed from anxiety, they may live in joy, peace, and health, we pray to you, O Lord.

*People:* **Lord, have mercy.**

*Leader:* For those serving in the military especially Jairus, Keith, Hannah, Jake, Ryan, Drew, Blake, Alex, Ashlyn, Jonathan, Guy, Lauren, Emily and Crystal, we pray to you, O Lord.

*People:* **Lord, have mercy.**

*Leader:* For those celebrating their anniversaries of birth, especially Sam, Megan, Joyce, Barbee, Helen, Joan; for those celebrating wedding anniversaries, especially Danielle and Paul, we pray to you, O Lord.

*People:* **Lord, have mercy.**

*Leader:* For all who have died, especially William and Adele, in the communion of your Church, and those whose faith is known to you alone, that, with all the saints, they may have rest in that place where there is no pain or grief, but life eternal, we pray to you, O Lord.

*People:* **Lord, have mercy.**

*Leader:* Rejoicing in the fellowship of the ever-Blessed Virgin Mary, and all the saints, let us commend ourselves, and one another, and all our life to Christ our God.

*People:* **To you, O Lord our God.**

*Silence*

*The Celebrant adds a concluding Collect, or the following Doxology*

**Celebrant:** Almighty God, by your Holy Spirit you have made us one with your saints in heaven and on earth: Grant that in our earthly pilgrimage we may always be supported by this fellowship of love and prayer, and know ourselves to be surrounded by their witness to your power and mercy. We ask this for the sake of Jesus Christ, in whom all our intercessions are acceptable through the Spirit, and who lives and reigns for ever and ever.

**People:** Amen.

*The People may kneel or stand as desired for the Confession of Sin.*

## **Confession of Sin**

*The Deacon or Celebrant says*

Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor.

*Silence may be kept.*

### **Minister and People**

Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your Name. Amen.

**Celebrant:** Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you all your sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life.

**People:** Amen.

*The people stand for the greeting of the Peace.*

## The Great Thanksgiving

*The people remain standing.*

### Eucharistic Prayer C

*The Celebrant says*

The Lord be with you.

**People:** And also with you.

*Celebrant:* Lift up your hearts.

**People:** We lift them to the Lord.

*Celebrant:* Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

**People:** It is right to give him thanks and praise.

*Then, facing the Holy Table, the Celebrant proceeds*

God of all power, Ruler of the Universe, you are worthy of glory and praise.

**People:** Glory to you for ever and ever.

*Celebrant:* At your command all things came to be: the vast expanse of interstellar space, galaxies, suns, the planets in their courses, and this fragile earth, our island home.

**People:** By your will they were created and have their being.

*Celebrant:* From the primal elements you brought forth the human race, and blessed us with memory, reason, and skill. You made us the rulers of creation. But we turned against you, and betrayed your trust; and we turned against one another.

**People:** Have mercy, Lord, for we are sinners in your sight.

*Celebrant:* Again and again, you called us to return. Through prophets and sages you revealed your righteous Law. And in the fullness of time you sent your only Son, born of a woman, to fulfill your Law, to open for us the way of freedom and peace.

**People:** By his blood, he reconciled us. By his wounds, we are healed.

*Celebrant:* And therefore we praise you, joining with the heavenly chorus, with prophets, apostles, and martyrs, and with all those in every generation who have looked to you in hope, to proclaim with them your glory, in their unending hymn:

## The Sanctus

*Celebrant and People*

Holy, Holy, Holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

*Then the Celebrant continues*

And so, Father, we who have been redeemed by him, and made a new people by water and the Spirit, now bring before you these gifts. Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ our Lord.

On the night he was betrayed he took bread, said the blessing, broke the bread, and gave it to his friends, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper, he took the cup of wine, gave thanks, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.

Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me.”

*Celebrant:* Remembering now his work of redemption, and offering to you this sacrifice of thanksgiving,

*People:* **We celebrate his death and resurrection, as we await the day of his coming.**

*Celebrant:* Lord God of our Fathers; God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob; God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ: Open our eyes to see your hand at work in the world about us. Deliver us from the presumption of coming to this Table for solace only, and not for strength; for pardon only, and not for renewal. Let the grace of this Holy Communion make us one body, one spirit in Christ, that we may worthily serve the world in his name.

*People:* **Risen Lord, be known to us in the breaking of the Bread.**

*Celebrant:* Accept these prayers and praises, Father, through Jesus Christ our great High Priest, to whom, with you and the Holy Spirit, your Church gives honor, glory, and worship, from generation to generation.

*People:* **Amen.**

*The people remain kneeling for the Lord's Prayer.*

### **The Lord's Prayer**

*Celebrant:* And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to pray,

*Celebrant and People:*

**Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.**




