The Lighting of the Candle

The Second Sunday of Advent

Reader: Jesus said, "I am the light of the world. Those who follow Me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life."

Celebrant: Our Lord says: "Surely I come quickly."

People: **Even so, come, Lord Jesus, come quickly!**

Reader: At the time John the Baptist came to the desert of Judea and started preaching. "Repent," he said, "for the Kingdom of Heaven is at hand!" John was the man the prophet Isaiah was talking about when he said, "The voice of one crying in the wilderness: Prepare the way of the lord, make His paths straight" (*Matthew 3:1-3*).

Celebrant: We light this candle to remind us of the last of the prophets, John the Baptist, who called all people to prepare for the coming of the Messiah. He asked us all to search our own hearts, and rid ourselves of the dark things that keep us from God and from each other.

The Second Candle is Lit.

A Short Pause

Celebrant: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People: **It is right to give Him thanks and praise.**

Celebrant: Let us pray.

Father, you sent John the Baptist to prepare the way for the Messiah. Help us to prepare our hearts for Christ to be born in them and to prepare our world for Christ to come and restore the Kingdom.

People: **Amen.**

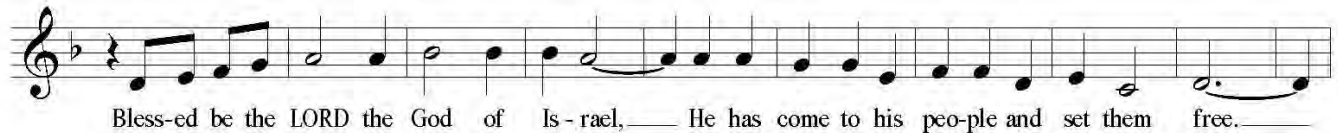

The Holy Gospel: Luke 3:1-6

Gospeler: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

People: Glory to you, Lord Christ.

In the fifteenth year of the reign of Emperor Tiberius, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, and Herod was ruler of Galilee, and his brother Philip ruler of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias ruler of Abilene, during the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah in the wilderness. He went into all the region around the Jordan, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the words of the prophet Isaiah, "The voice of one crying out in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight. Every valley shall be filled, and every mountain and hill shall be made low, and the crooked shall be made straight, and the rough ways made smooth; and all flesh shall see the salvation of God.'"

Celebrant and People

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God,

Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

A RITE OF ADMINISTRATION OF FIRST COMMUNION

(10 a.m. only)

Immediately following the Nicene Creed, the first communion candidates, with their parents or Godparents, proceed to the chancel steps.

Celebrant: In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

People: Amen.

Celebrant: Dear Friends: When our Lord Jesus came into the world, He became a child and grew in wisdom, age, and grace in the eyes of the Father and of all who knew Him. He welcomed children, believed in their dignity, and held them up as a model for all who are seeking the Kingdom of God.

But children do need the help of adults if they are to develop their individual gifts, and their moral, mental, and physical attributes, and so reach human and Christian maturity.

These candidates have dedicated themselves in preparation for reception of the Eucharist and hope to be found ready for this next step in their journey of initiation into the Church.

Let us therefore ask for God's blessing on these children as they have completed their first communion classes and are to receive their communion that they will be encouraged to continue growing in love and relationship with God and with all persons.

Sponsor: I present to you these children to receive the Sacrament of Holy Communion.

Celebrant: Are these children you present prepared by a commitment to Christ as Lord, by regular attendance at worship, and by the knowledge of their duties as Christians, to exercise their ministry to the honor of God, and the well-being of his Church?

Sponsor: I believe they are.

Celebrants: What is the outward and visible sign in the Eucharist?

Candidates: The outward and visible sign in the Eucharist is bread and wine, given and received according to Christ's command.

Celebrant: What is the inward and spiritual grace given in the Eucharist?

Candidates: The inward and spiritual grace in the Holy Communion is the Body and Blood of Christ given to his people, and received by faith.

Celebrant: What are the benefits which we receive in the Lord's Supper?

Candidates: The benefits we receive are the forgiveness of our sins, the strengthening of our union with Christ and one another, and the foretaste of the heavenly banquet which is our nourishment in eternal life.

Celebrant: What is required of us when we come to the Eucharist?

Candidates: It is required that we should examine our lives, repent of our sins, and be in love and charity with all people.

The First Communicant candidates kneel while their parents or Godparents remain standing, and place a hand upon the shoulder of the child they are sponsoring. The Celebrant extends a hand toward them and says:

Celebrant: May Almighty God, our heavenly Father, who has put the desire into your hearts to seek the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, grant you the power of the Holy Spirit to persevere in this intention and to grow in faith and understanding.

People: Amen.

Each First Communicant candidate is presented by name to the Celebrant, who, with the thumb, marks a cross on the forehead of each candidate, saying:

Celebrant: Heavenly Father, send your blessing on N.N. (Cooper Maxwell / Caroline Grace / Graham Evan / Elise Madeliene) as he/she receives his/her First Communion. May he/she grow more into your presence and likeness.

People: Amen.

N., (Cooper / Caroline / Graham / Elise) receive the sign of the Cross on your forehead and in your heart, in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

People: Amen.

Celebrant: Lord Jesus Christ, you loved children so much that you said: "Whoever welcome a child welcomes me." Hear our prayers and, with your unfailing protection, watch over these children whom you have blessed with the grace of Your Body and Blood. When they have grown to maturity, grant that they will confess your name in willing faith, be fervent in love, and persevere courageously in the hope of reaching your Kingdom, where you live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, forever and ever.

People: Amen.

The people may sit or stand, as desired during the Eucharistic Prayer.

Then the Celebrant continues

We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore, according to his command, O Father,

Celebrant and People:

We remember his death. We proclaim his resurrection. We await his coming in glory.

The Celebrant continues

And we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, O Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine.

We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts that they may be the Sacrament of the Body of Christ and his Blood of the new Covenant. Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we may be acceptable through him, being sanctified by the Holy Spirit. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us to that heavenly country where, with the Blessed Virgin Mary, _____, and all your saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation.

By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever.

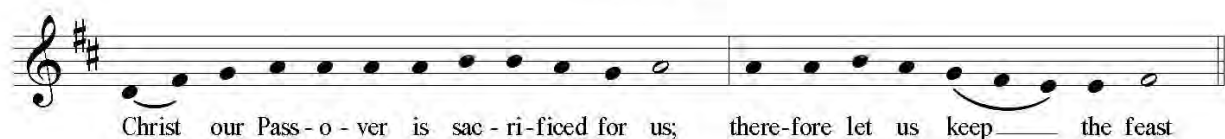

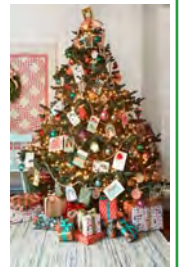
