Mission Plan

- + At the Leadership Retreat held earlier this year, our Leadership Team identified about fifteen (15) goals or proposals, based on the five (5) purposes of the Church: Worship, Service/Ministry, Outreach/Mission, Fellowship, and Discipleship. Deacon's Report



Greetings everyone,

I don't know how it is for all of you, our devoted All Saints' members, but my activities have increased dramatically as we approach the fall. Especially, I am involved again in Kairos Prison Ministry. This ministry has been very active in Florida since 1976. It is an

ecumenical Christian organization and extends to all people regardless of their religious beliefs, gender, race or ethnic background.

There are three Kairos programs, Kairos Inside, Kairos Outside and Kairos Torch. Briefly, Kairos meaning "God's time" is provided to those inmates (or residents) in State Prisons and also to women (Kairos Outside) who have male friends or family in prison and also to juveniles Kairos Torch) who are incarcerated.

I am a volunteer for MTCI, Kairos in Martin County Correctional Institution which will have a Kairos weekend #53 from October 20-23. This week, we will be having our first three-hour meeting on Thursday evening and will have meetings every Thursday evening until we enter the prison on October 20. We have over 50 volunteers for this weekend which will have 36 to 42 residents present for the whole weekend. Kairos has over forty programs in Florida alone. Much of the program is very similar to Cursillo.

Kairos keeps expanding its programs every year. A long term study has been made of Kairos and the findings have shown very clearly that all residents who have completed a Kairos weekend are much less likely to be recidivists. We are currently working on a Kairos Program for death row offenders in Union Prison which has 361 offenders but DOC has not yet approved this program. There is a program in Texas now which is working quite well and we plan to study this to bring Kairos to Florida's Death Row.

Many of you have been specifically supportive of the Kairos

Our next meeting for the All Saints' Chapter of the Daughters of the King will be on Monday, October 3, 2022 at 6:00 p.m. in the Church building.



Peering Into the Past

<u>The 75th Anniversary</u> of All Saints', when the Rector was the Rev. Frank Alvarez and Senior Warden was Wallace Fletcher, was celebrated based upon the consecration date of Feb 19th,1899.

During the 7th Annual Convocation of the Church in the Missionary District of Southern Florida, held January 25–28, 1899, Archdeacon Brown reported on his work for the year 1898.

"Rt. Rev. Father in God: ...
"At Eden a larger Church has been built and consecrated within the year. St. Paul's Church, Eden, is a model of a complete country Church, and reflects great credit on all who were in responsible charge of the work.

On St. Paul's Church there remains an indebtedness of only fifty-six dollars. About six miles farther South. at. Waveland. another Church, All Saints', is now being completed and awaits consecration on July 19th. This making the third Church within the East Coast Archdeaconal iurisdiction since our last convocation...."

The 100th Anniversary of All Saints' was celebrated during the days of the Rev. Thomas Ryan, Jr. and Senior Warden, Gayle Schneider based upon the date the cornerstone was laid of December 5th, 1898.

On Monday [December 5th, 1898] the ceremony of laying the corner stone of All Saints church took place. Archdeacon Brown officiated. The stone was laid by

Mrs. C. H. [Mary] Racey. Inside the corner stone the following items were placed: a prayer book1, a copy of the Indian River Advocate, Times-Union and Citizen newspapers and paper containing the names of the founders, Mr. and Mrs. C. H. Racey, by whom this beautiful church is being erected for the benefit of the inhabitants of Jensen, Waveland, Sewall's Point, Stuart, and St. Lucie River: and the names of the building committee, composed of Mr. G. E. Male, Mr. C. H. Racey, and Dr. W. C. Sneden, were also inscribed on the above paper. Among those present we noticed Mr. and Mrs. Racey, Mrs. Mun???? 2, Mrs. Harmer, Waveland; Mrs. Hebbert, Mr. and Mrs. Wollard, Mrs. Bell, Mr. G. E. Male, Mr. F.V. Tyndall, and Mr. Bell and staff, Mr. H. Richards of Eden, accompanied the Archdeacon. It was an impressive and interesting ceremony and passed off well."

God willing, the 125th Anniversary of All Saints' will be celebrated during the days of the Rev. Dr. Anthony B. Holder and the Senior Warden (to be selected) based upon the date the cornerstone was laid. (1898+125 = 2023).



First published in 1978, Richard Foster's book on the Christian spiritual life focuses on the inward, the outward, and the group practices that lead to personal spiritual growth. Over two million copies have been sold. I first came upon this book about 10 years ago and it changed my life.

The book provides tools and directions by which I am able to settle my mind, open myself to hear God's Word, and focus on my purpose as "God's agent." Given my impulsive and hurried character, I need help in all areas of my spiritual development. Contemplative prayer is just one among 12 distinct practices outlined in the book. The practice of such prayer has proven essential in my experience of the renewing Power of the Holy Spirit. I highly recommend this book if you are

seeking to enhance your spiritual life.


