# Deacon's Report

The new season at our church is starting again.

It's been a hot, hot summer, hotter than most of us can remember. There has been a break for most of us, but all are getting ready for fall.

I had a wonderful cruise in late July and August. I saw many places I had never been to. We cruised along the Moselle out of Brussels and followed this river to where it connects with the Rhine and all the magnificent sites there and ended up in wonderful Amsterdam. All was great!

Now I am starting to resume my work in the Martin Correctional Institution. I lead a weekly Bible study at MCI on Thursday afternoons from 1:30 to 3. I have a nucleus of men who attend every week and actively participate in the evening prayer service and do all four Bible selections for the day. We end with Communion and the prayer of St Francis. The regular attendees really seem to benefit from this format. We always sing the Lord's Prayer, which they love.

I am planning to be a part of the upcoming Kairos Weekend, which will be at the prison the third weekend of October. This is an intensive experience for those who attend. Kairos follows the same format as the Cursillo weekend, starting on Thursday evening and continuing for the next three days. Our intention is to bring the love of Christ to these men, and, to help them understand how Christ can change their lives.

We will start the program this week at the First Presbyterian Church in North Palm Beach. The training is for eight weeks from 6 to 9 p.m. Thursdays. We prepare ourselves to be good volunteers and get to know each other as spiritual brothers.

Studies have been done about Kairos' effect on

prisoners and have shown this experience to make significant change in the men that prevents recidivism. Many volunteers like me have been doing these weekends for many years and really love the program.

My other activities at All Saints' involve facilitating the program for our members who are unable to attend church because of long-term or acute disabilities. We have several members who are Lay Eucharistic Visitors who bring Communion to those who are unable to attend church. The people we visit do really appreciate seeing us and they do really feel connected to our church. If you know of others who may want to have Communion brought out to them, please let us know.

The other program I have been working on with Father and George Mazsa is the TRUE Fund, Toward the Relief of Unusual Emergencies. We have drafted a new set of bylaws to update this program. All Saints' has had the TRUE Fund for many years but has not had as many applicants in the past couple of years since the pandemic started. We are available to help others in need, such as to provide help with paying utility bills on a short term basis. This program also may be able to help similar clients of other agencies such as House of Hope and the Salvation Army.

Thank you all for all the help you give us in supporting these services.

Prayerfully consider one person in your sphere of influence that you need to share the message of salvation with.





### Cemetery Documentation goes to The Cloud

Our thanks to Duncan Hurd for finding Cemify, our new user-friendly software.

Thanks to Duncan's software find, Pam Hurd and I have found a whole new hobby – working ceaselessly, transitioning the data from the original cemetery records, the handwritten maps and our scanned documents, and then putting in all the longitude and latitude coordinates we obtained from the Bowman Consultants.

Fully implemented, Cemify will enable us to easily capture the number of lots available for



cremation or casket burials, the number of individuals interred, the breakdown of casket burials to cremation burials and so much more. See the sample, below.


The BIG transition of cemetery documentation from scanned documents on one computer to having it backed up in the cloud and online in Cemify is moving forward.

## Peering Into the Past

# The first wedding in our church building was in October 1927.

"HOMAN - STOCKLEY, NUPTIALS

"A most attractive wedding was solemnized at the All Saints Episcopal church at Waveland, Thursday afternoon at 2 o'clock, when Mr. Chester M. Homan, Chief of the Stuart Department and Miss Vera Lily Stockley of Salerno were united in marriage by the Reverend W. P.S. Lander of Holy Trinity Episcopal church of West Palm Beach.

The church was prettily decorated with garden flowers of varied colors with maiden hair fern twined among the bright colors. Mrs. C. H. Rue played the "Flower Song" as friends and neighbors gathered to witness the ceremony. Mrs. M. R. Cartwright sang "Beauty's Eyes" and "I Love You Truly," by Carrie Jacob Band. Mendelsohn's "Here Comes the Bride" heralded the approach of the bridal party, which was preceded by the ushers, Mr. L. E. Davis and Mr. C.H. Rue. Mr. Homan and his best man awaited the bride at the altar. She came on the arm of her father, Mr. James Stockley, over a flower strewn path, preceded by dainty little flower girl Velma Lovelle Davis, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. L. E. Davis of Stuart, dressed in a dainty peach georgette, carrying a basket of roses.

Mrs. James Stockley, the bride's mother, wore a dark blue georgette with a large black hat, while the attendants and party wore dainty gowns of georgette ranging in colors from the peach of the organist's to that of orchid of the matron of honor, each attendant wearing a large picture hat.

A wedding luncheon was served at the home at Salerno to the bridal party and near friends.

Here the tables were centered with ferns and hibiscus. Mrs. Stockley was assisted by Mrs. J. P.

Wilbar, Mrs. C. E. Pitts and Miss Betty Wilbar, in serving the luncheon.

Many beautiful and useful gifts of silver, china and linen were received, showing the many friedships of both in Salerno and Stuart.

Mr. Chester Homan is the son of Mr. and Mrs. George S. Homan of Jamaica, Long Island, New York. He came to Stuart five years ago and has made this city his home since that time. He was made chief of the fire department of Stuart last January after having served that department two years and is also a member of the Knights of Pythians lodge.

Mrs. Homan is a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. James Stockley of Salerno. She has been prominent with the young people of this section; belongs to the Auxiliary of the American Legion and is a member of the Pythian Sisters and the Golden Triangle of that order in this city.

After the reception Mr. and Mrs. Homan left in their car for a honeymoon on the west coast. Upon their return they will make their home in Stuart, and after the first of November they will be at home to their friends at the Charlotte apartment in the Bessey addition.:

The Parish Register shows Chester Marion Homan, age 30 of Stuart, Fla., and his parents. His bride was the 21-year-old Vera Lillian Stockly of Salerno, Fla. Her parents and their witnesses, Roscoe L. Bell and Thelma Bell.

Interestingly enough, the register doesn't tell us where the weddings are held. Therefore, the first one listed isn't the first one to be held in the church.
