My Dear Friends:

This month of December will be busy and packed, but exciting for us as a church family at All Saints. We will be having a number of services and events that will form part of the celebrations of our 125th Anniversary.

December 3 marks the beginning of a new Church or Christian Liturgical Year. It is the

Then on **December 9,** we will host our Annual Holly Fair, one of our Church's important

share the proclamation with you when we receive it.

Please remember the Church Office will be closed from Christmas Day until New Year's Day, and will reopen on **January 2**. This

closure is in keeping with that of the Bishop's Office.

In addition to all that is going on at All Saints' this month, I will be attending the St. Nicholas' Party which is hosted by the Bishop, and is simply a Christmas party for the clergy. Deacon's Report

As you all know, I celebrated the 10th anniversary of my ordination as deacon. Six of us were ordained on Nov. 23, 2013, in our diocesan cathedral by Bishop Leo Frade.

I had been looking for ways to use my time as a retired professional social worker. Our former deacon resigned in April 2010, and I felt God's call to become a deacon, which required three years of education followed by clinical preparation with Vista Hospice agency where I served as a chaplain.

From the beginning of my ministry, I was asked to lead our pastoral care at All Saints', reaching out to members in need of our spiritual involvement. I often provided the Eucharist. I visited members who are either in acute distress or are no longer able to attend services. Pastoral care includes giving them Communion, but also assisting in any way we can during their illnesses. Others served as Lay Eucharistic Visitors. We are a church, I think, that reaches out and connects with all of our members. Janet Kempf did this every week along with her husband, Fred. Janet recently died just before her 100th birthday.

My other functions included administering our TRUE Fund from which we provide financial assistance. We can help members of our own church as well as residents of nearby neighborhoods. We pay cash to their landlords, FPL and others to whom they owe. We provide gift cards for grocery stores. As we expand this program, we collaborate with other agencies. Salvation Army and House of Hope refer clients to us when they are unable to help.

My other ministry has been at Martin Correctional Institution where I do Bible Study every Thursday afternoon. A significant number of men attend my Bible Study, Evening Prayer service and receive Holy Communion from our consecrated bread. The Roman Catholic deacons only give Communion to baptized Catholics.

I continue to be a volunteer for Kairos (God's time), a worldwide program. It is based on Cursillo and is designed to bring the love of Christ to those in prison and to their spouses through a community program. It has been a very successful program, transforming the lives of prisoners. I have done over 20 weekends at MCI and have been reconciled with this program, despite some


Participants will **enjoy** a festive evening starting with **cocktails** and **appetizers** at one home, **dinner** at a second home, and **dessert** at a third home.






